The children have done incredibly well learning their scripts and the songs, particularly given that the performances had to be moved forward by almost a month to accommodate new High School transition arrangements at Sherburn. This week's goings on! :

Class 1 News

A lovely week in class 1 with the children continuing their topic on habitats and enjoying our second visit to the local woods.

In literacy we have shared the story of Rumpelstiltskin. Reception children have talked about where the story is set and who are the main characters. The rest of the class have used adjectives to describe the characters and have explained how they know their choice of adjective is a good choice. We have also focused on different sentence types with the children deciding whether a sentence is a question, exclamation, statement or command.

In numeracy we are focusing on doubling numbers and building up the speed of our recall of number facts. All the Y1/2 children have a sheet of questions they are working on in their book bags. They are given one and a half or two minutes to complete a sheet before progressing to the next. Already every child has either moved up a sheet or beaten their target each time. Well done everybody! Keep practising - every day if possible.

Class 2 News

Years 3 and 4 have focused on maths this week alongside show practise. Year 3 have looked at angles and parallel and perpendicular lines, whilst Year 4 have been reading and plotting co-ordinates and translating shapes.

Years 5 and 6 have been planning and writing longer stories. They also have written some great poems to reflect on how great their dads and grandads are!

Class 2 have continued to amaze us with their singing, acting and dancing talents. Some of our smallest people have the biggest voices! In PSHE the children have been making some amazing creations that represent themselves and their personalities.
