Class 1 News

We have made it to Easter and I think everybody is ready for a lovely long rest. The children have coped really well with a lot of upheaval at school. This continues after Easter although our new classroom is now beginning to take shape.

This week we have continued to work on sentence structure and the children have written fantasy stories based in a real life setting to practise this.

In numeracy we have started looking at time. Year 2 children will be learning to tell the time to five minutes on an analogue clock. Year 1 children will work on time to the hour and half hour. Please practise measuring time at home in different ways.

All year 1 and 2 children have keyword spellings to practise.

Years 3 and 4 have been practising their descriptive writing skills using expanded noun phrases, similes and powerful verbs to draft a paragraph about the Easter Bunny but without using the words Easter or bunny.

In Maths, Year 3 have completed their topic about money focusing on word problems, whilst Year 4 finished learning about decimals by looking at decimal fraction equivalents.
